# Luke 13:1-9

# Repent or Perish

13 Now there were some present at that time who told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mixed with their sacrifices. <sup>2</sup> Jesus answered, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered this way? <sup>3</sup> I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish. <sup>4</sup> Or those eighteen who died when the tower in Siloam fell on them—do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusalem? <sup>5</sup> I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish."

<sup>6</sup> Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree growing in his vineyard, and he went to look for fruit on it but did not find any. <sup>7</sup> So he said to the man who took care of the vineyard, 'For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any. Cut it down! Why should it use up the soil?'

<sup>8</sup> "'Sir,' the man replied, 'leave it alone for one more year, and I'll dig around it and fertilize it. <sup>9</sup> If it bears fruit next year, fine! If not, then cut it down."

#### Coronavirus Update

From Monday 21st February 2022 the government announced a new set of guidelines for 'Living with Covid-19'. We are very grateful for your support over the last two years, and we are very proud of the way our pupils and families have conducted themselves during this difficult time.

The current guidelines are:

# Self-Isolation

You are still advised to stay home after a positive test for 5 full days, and then only end isolation after two negative test results (i.e. on Day 5 and Day 6). Please contact the school and let us know if your child is isolating due to Covid-19. Work will continue to be provided on Google Classroom for children self-isolating from a positive Covid test.

#### Close Contacts

There is no need to test daily or self-isolate if a close contact regardless of vaccine status. However, if your son/daughter is a close contact you might want to test them regularly to ensure that they are not Covid positive.

# **Symptoms**

If you are displaying any of the symptoms Covid-19, you are to stay at home and arrange a test. You should not attend school with any Covid-19 symptoms until you have got a negative test result.

# Face Coverings

These are no longer a requirement, but they are still recommended currently on public transport.
