The Gospel story of the Good Samaritan was a focal point throughout the fortnight as children explored the ideas of being a neighbour; what are the rights and responsibilities of a neighbour.

Another area explored during the week was the rights of children.

They looked at their right to be heard; their right to get information that is important to their well-being; the right to protection from any kind of exploitation among many others.
