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Black History Month













The focus for this year's Black History Month was The Empire Windrush. 2023 marked the 75th anniversary since the Windrush docked at Tilbury docks. Children looked at the journey on the vessel and explored different Historical sources to find out more life back then.







Anti- Bullying Week

During the week beginning 13th November, we marked Anti-Bullying
 Week. The theme this year was 'Make a Noise About Bullying'.
 At St Michael's during Anti-Bullying Week, we came together to have
 discussions about what bullying means to us, how banter can turn into
 something more hurtful, and what we can do to stop bullying.

We started the week with Odd Socks Day on Monday, 13th November.

 day to show their commitment to standing up against bullying.

Choir

For two consecutive Mondays, St Michael's Choir and other schools travelled to St. Antony's Primary School in Forest Gate for rehearsals. In anticipation, the children crammed, memorised and practised the lyrics of 5 songs in preparation for The East London Community Organisation (TELCO) concert at the London ExCel on Wednesday 29th November.

On the day in question, it was a beehive of activity at the London ExCel with last minute practise, sound checks and then the thumping of the big drums. St Michael's Choir and the other schools were affiliated as The Newham Choir for the grand night. As the thousand or more empty seats began to fill up, the children's nerves evolved like a gridlock of emotions on the M25. In order to soothe their anxieties, their teacher and parents could only offer words of encouragement. However, as the roar of the drumming and the strumming of Master Chan's guitar fought for dominance in the arena, the children's nerves were spontaneously left behind in their seats as they ambled towards the stage to take their positions for their highly-anticipated ensemble performance.

As proud parents listened to their children's voices belting out syncopated beats to songs, among others, a song composed by the previous Year 6 of St. Michael's - Our East London Home. The applause from the audience raised the roof of The Platinum Suite and probably rang out to the nearby streets of Custom House. If the neighbours of the London ExCel did not hear the symphony of voices, perhaps they were fast asleep because of the time of the event. The event was held nearly past the children's bedtime, but that did stop the St. Michael's Choir and the other schools (aka The Newham Choir) let rip with sheer, exceptional, unmitigated, powerfully trained vocal cords, to celebrate TELCO's 25th anniversary in songs and amazing singing.
