Of our year 6 cohort of 30 pupils: 20 felt they were confident and proficient over a distance of at least 25 meters. 18 felt they could use a range of strokes effectively and 15 felt they could perform safe self-rescue in difficult water based situations.			

As a whole school initiative, children in KS1 AND KS2 are participating in the 'Daily Mile' an initiative to get schoolchildren to walk or run a mile every day. This has proven this leads to significant improvement in their health, according to a study.

The balance of £5,115 will be carried forward 2023 2024 budget and allocated to the PE budget.
